

Email Tips

Here are a few email 'tips' you can use:

- Is the default brightness of your mailbox scorching your eyeballs? Try adjusting the default settings. In Outlook, choose File -> Options -> General, and look for "Office Theme" on the right side.
 Experiment with the other options from the dropdown menu.
- Schedule an email delivery for later: Type up your email, and in the message, click the Options tab, Delay Delivery, and set the time and date in the "Do not deliver before" fields.
- Show your emails as conversations: Rather than having to scroll through an email looking for someone's response, you can choose to show all your emails as a 'conversation.' In Outlook, click View and check the "Show as Conversation' box.
- Sticky notes: In Outlook, click Ctrl+Shift+N to bring up a sticky note you can type in and drag wherever you need it.

Skyward Teacher Log

Skyward has the ability to allow teachers to keep a record of all communication, intervention, and general activities associated with a student: The Teacher Log.


Available in the Gradebook, the teacher can open a class and go to Display Options -> Teacher's log, and record entries for students. Another way is to click on a student's name and choose "Teacher's Log."

When adding the log entries, the teacher can choose whether or not to post the entry to Student and/or Family Access. These entries can also be deleted by the teacher; however, if not deleted by the teacher, they remain a permanent part of the gradebook.

The log entries can be extremely handy for documenting student behaviors, parent contact, and conferences. These logs can also be attached to student progress reports. For more information, in Skyward, click on "?", choose SkyDoc, and type in Teacher's Log.

ClassLink Tips

Want to see your school network files from home? Log into Classlink. Clicking "My Files" at the bottom of the Classlink window will allow you to access documents stored on the H drive of your work computer from anywhere.



<u>iPad Tip</u>: Forgot your Apple ID password? Go to <u>https://iforgot.apple.com</u>, and put in the email address of your account. You can choose to answer the security questions or receive an email so you can reset the password.

iPad Tips for iOS 13

The new iOS is here! iOS 13 has some great new features you want to try including

- **Dark mode**: Settings -> Display & Brightness & choose Dark Mode on the right. If 'Dark mode' all the time is too much, you can turn on "Automatic," from there, you can choose options as to when dark mode comes on.
- Preview Photos: You can set your photos & videos on your iPad to auto play.
- Edit Photos: When you take a photo, tap on it to bring up the editing menu. You have a lot more control over what you can do: edit specific aspects of the photo, experiment with numerous presets, white-balance, and non-destructive video edits.
- **Undo & Redo Typing swipes**: To undo typing, swipe left with three fingers on the screen; to redo, swipe right with three fingers.
- **Downloads from Safari**: You can now download files from Safari. By default, they go to your iCloud account which now has a Downloads folder, but you can create a folder on your iPad. From the page, click the up arrow on the top right, choose "Save to Files," choose "On My iPad," and click the *New folder icon. Name the file whatever you like.

This is by no means a comprehensive list. Experiment, search online, or check with your tech specialist to learn more.
